CMC has bi-monthly infrastructure meetings, in person or via conference call and the CMC team is moving forward and the current issue is the water/sewer infrastructure with the City. The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT)

needs the water/sewer issues finalized so they may begin their work. ODOT has advised that they will begin their bid process the beginning of October. CMC had given us an extension for city water/sewer service until December 1, 2016. Bob Weinhoffer met with the Secretary of Commerce, the ODOT director and the Tax Commissioner to update them on the project and they are all on board and moving forward in support of the Durant CMC project.

Jacque Wilson advised that the City has received the 7.5 acres that has been deeded to the City and he plans to send that information to ODOT so they can begin bidding the road work.

Tommy Kramer also advised that AT&T is on board with relocations of their phone lines and Plyler Construction won the bid to build the office, scale house and employee welfare area. Tommy also met with Jay Perry and ODOT in regards to Sawmill Road and within 24 hours the road work had begun.

Tommy Kramer was informed today that on August 16, 2016 a group of CMC top managers from the CMC America Corp will be coming to Durant to tour the community and look over the project construction.

Tommy Kramer spoke with Stuart England and the TIF documents should be completed by the end of August. The banks are on board and the letters of intent are completed as to fund the TIF.

VII. Update and Review of the BrucePac Workforce Forgivable LoanTommy Kramer

Tommy Kramer advised the loan is completed and the \$700,000 check was sent to BrucePac on July 23, 2016. They have already met the criteria for the workforce loan and will provide quarterly reports over the next seven years to the DIA office.

Tommy Kramer advised that he and Mike Garrison, Operations Manager for The Tile Shop, toured the old Clint Williams peanut facility on Waldron Drive, for a possible temporary storage warehouse. The Tile Shop re-bid their 88,000 sf building this week, Plyler Construction won the bid and it will be funded with New Market Tax Credits.

The Cornerstone building is being rehabilitated for Project Web and the closing is set for September 2016. Mr. Sullivan, the current owner is working with FEMA on correcting their documentation in regards to flood plains.

Cardinal Glass' new 112,000 sf distribution center and warehouse will be complete by the end of August.

The national big box retail grocery store project has accepted Durant as their home. The project will include an approximately 60,000 sf grocery store, gas station and retail stores. There are currently eight properties under contract for this project and Tommy Kramer is working with the civil engineer and Mayor Hoffman in regards to vacating the city street and utility easements, rezoning and widening West Main Street.

Gaming Capital Group has completed their new facility and have moved out of the old Goody's building on Radio Road.

Jacque Wilson stated that they are working through where the OG&E transmission line easements will go for the CMC project. The City wants to be sure that the eleven easements are in the best location for future growth and once that is completed, we will move forward.
