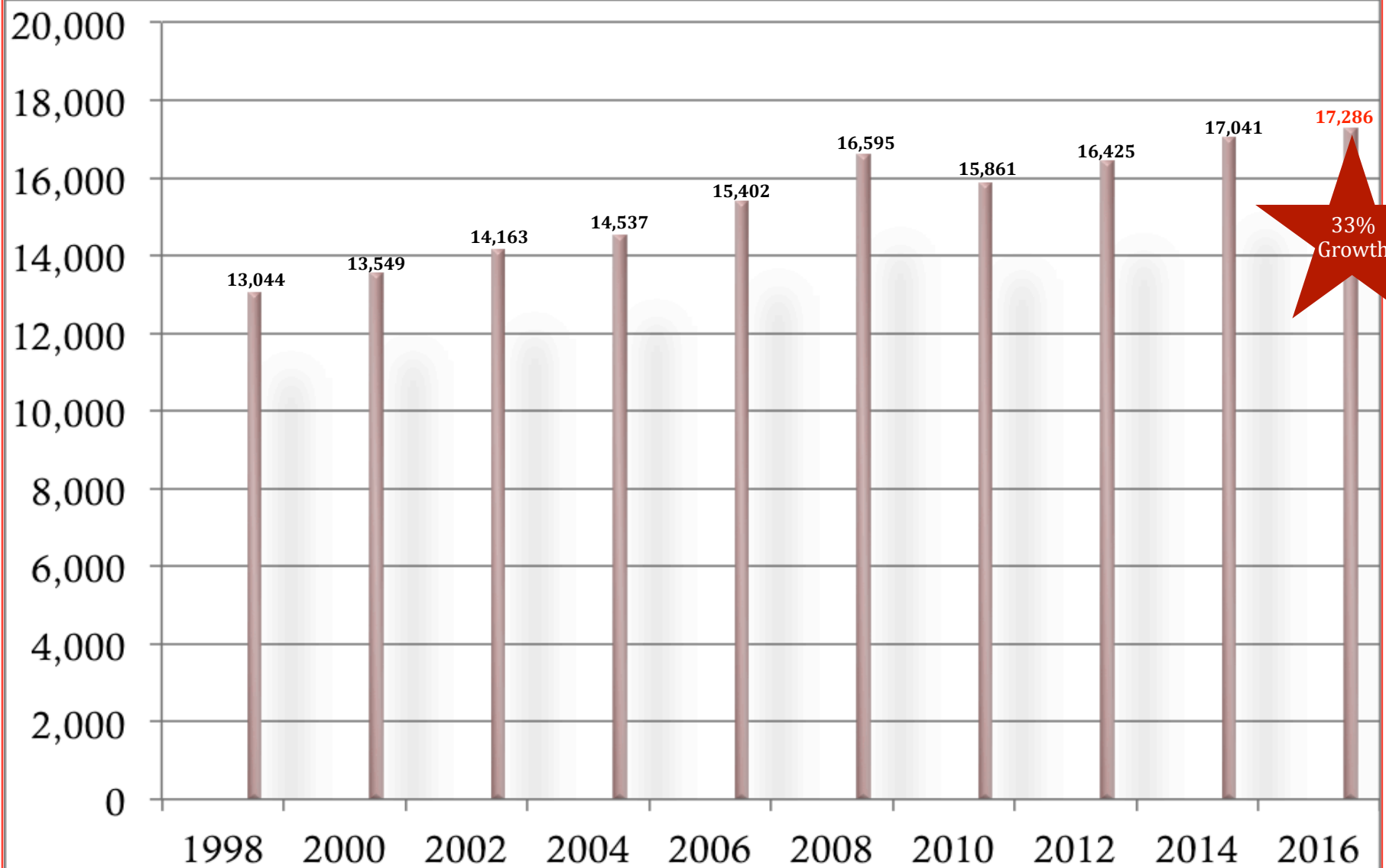

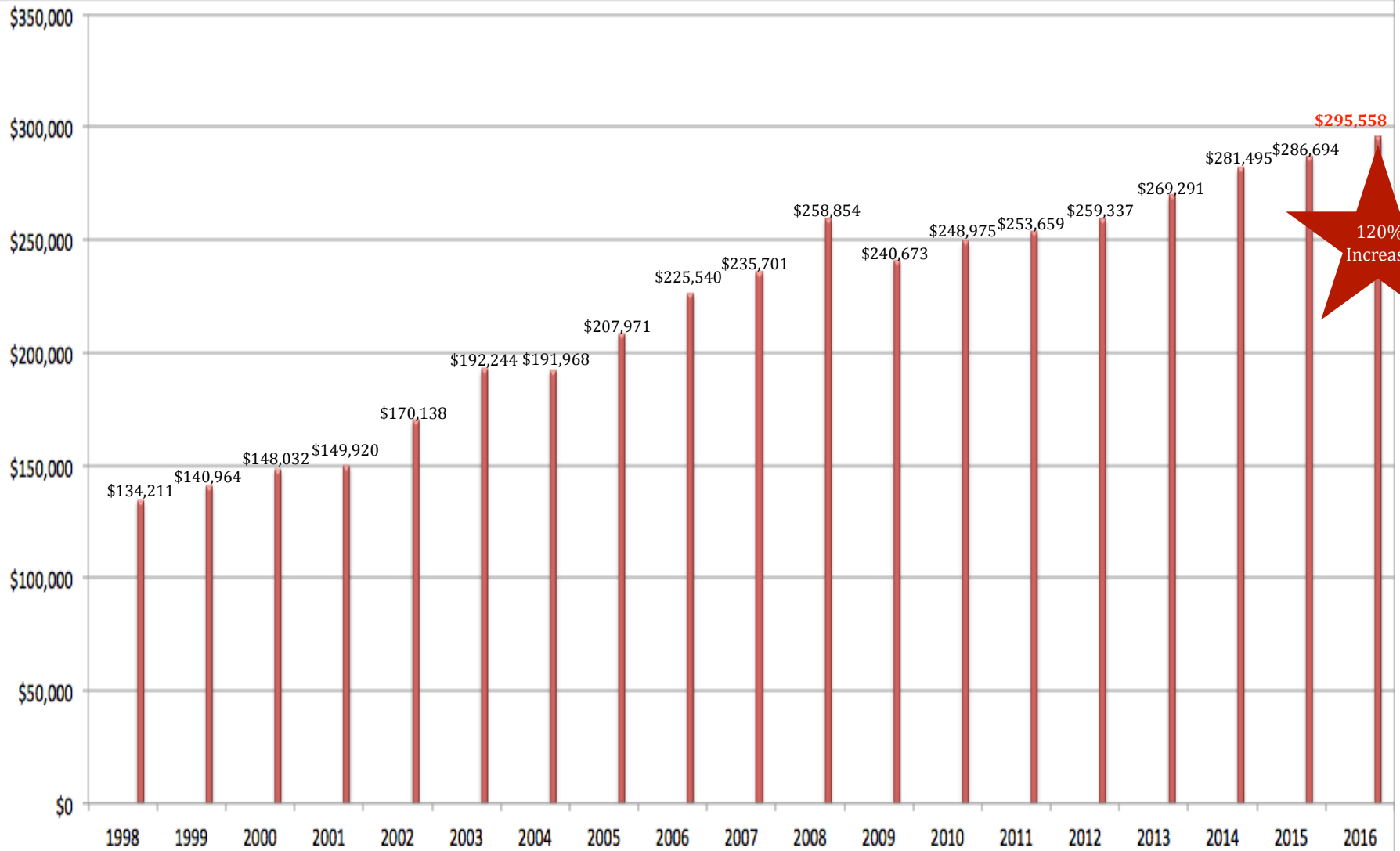

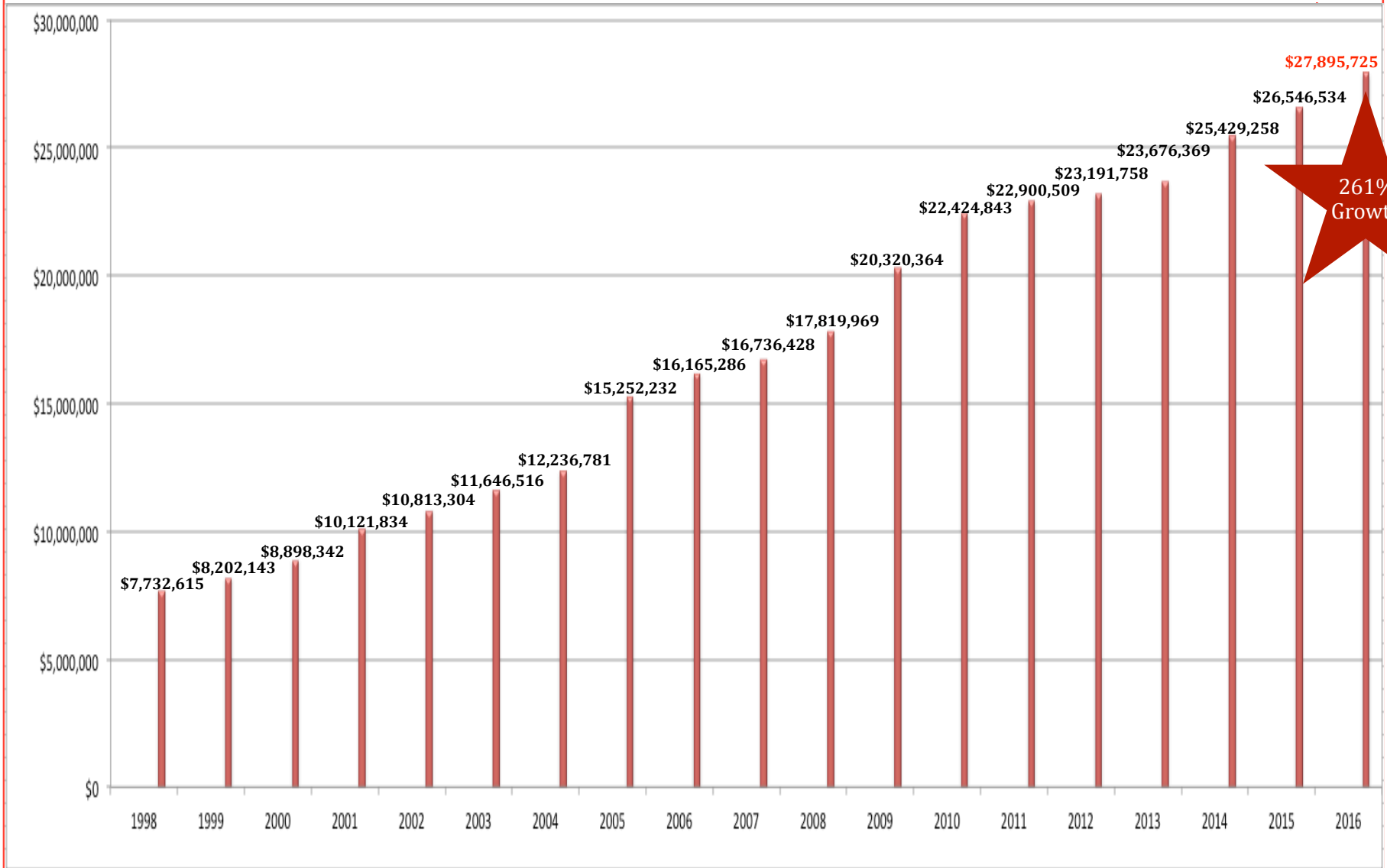

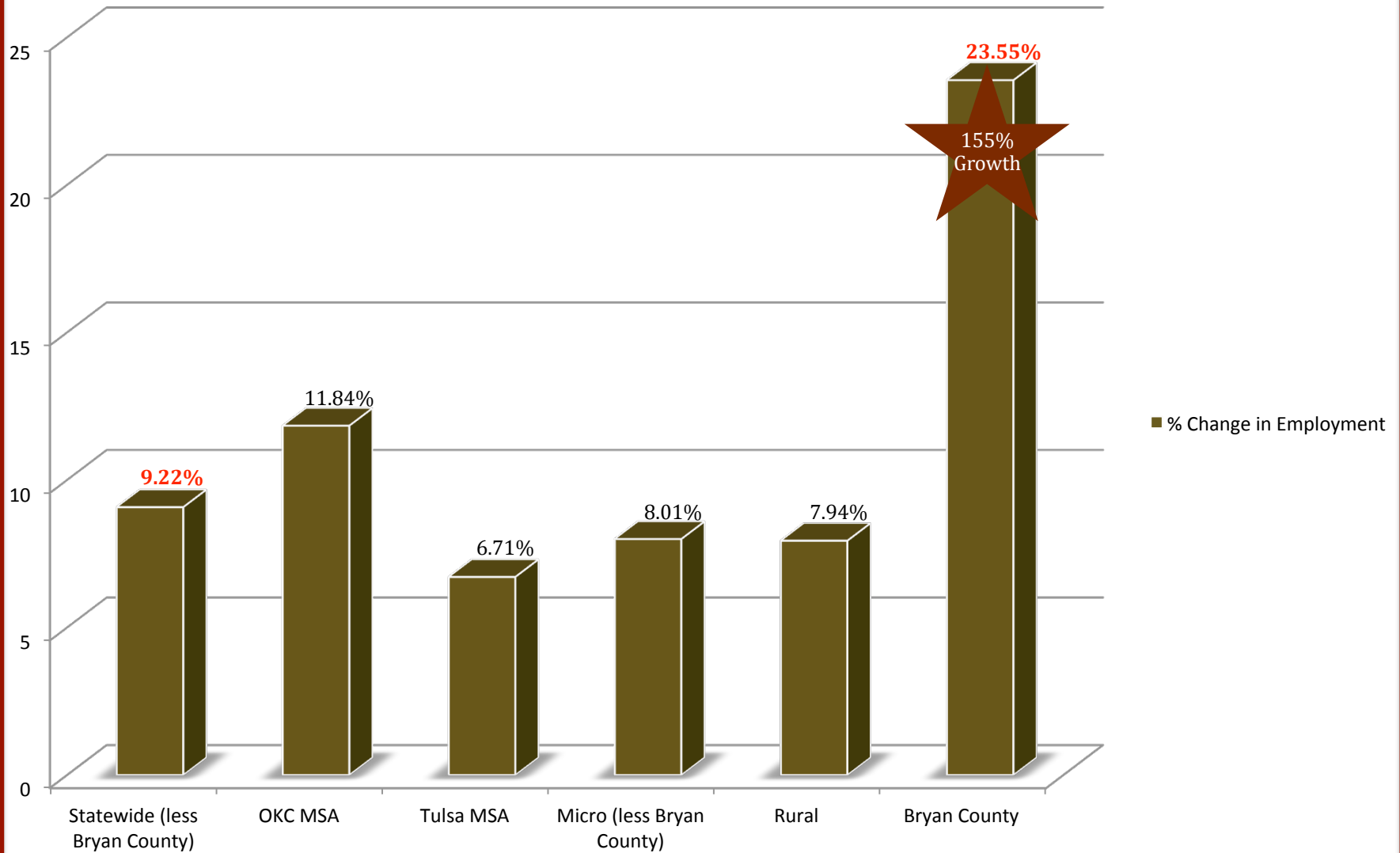
Bryan County Ad Valorem Original Tax Rolls 1998 - 2016

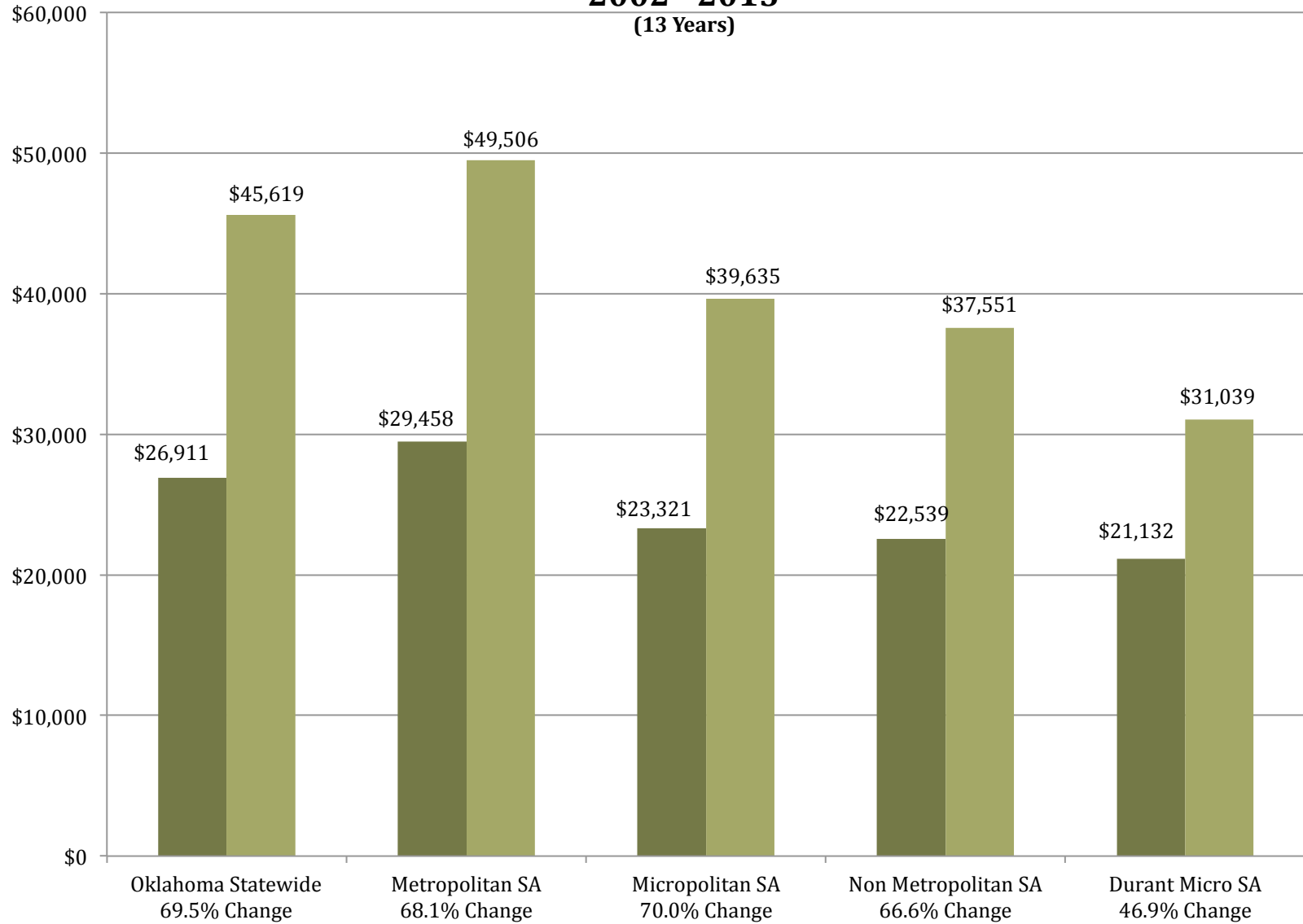

Durant & Bryan County Employment Growth 2002-2016



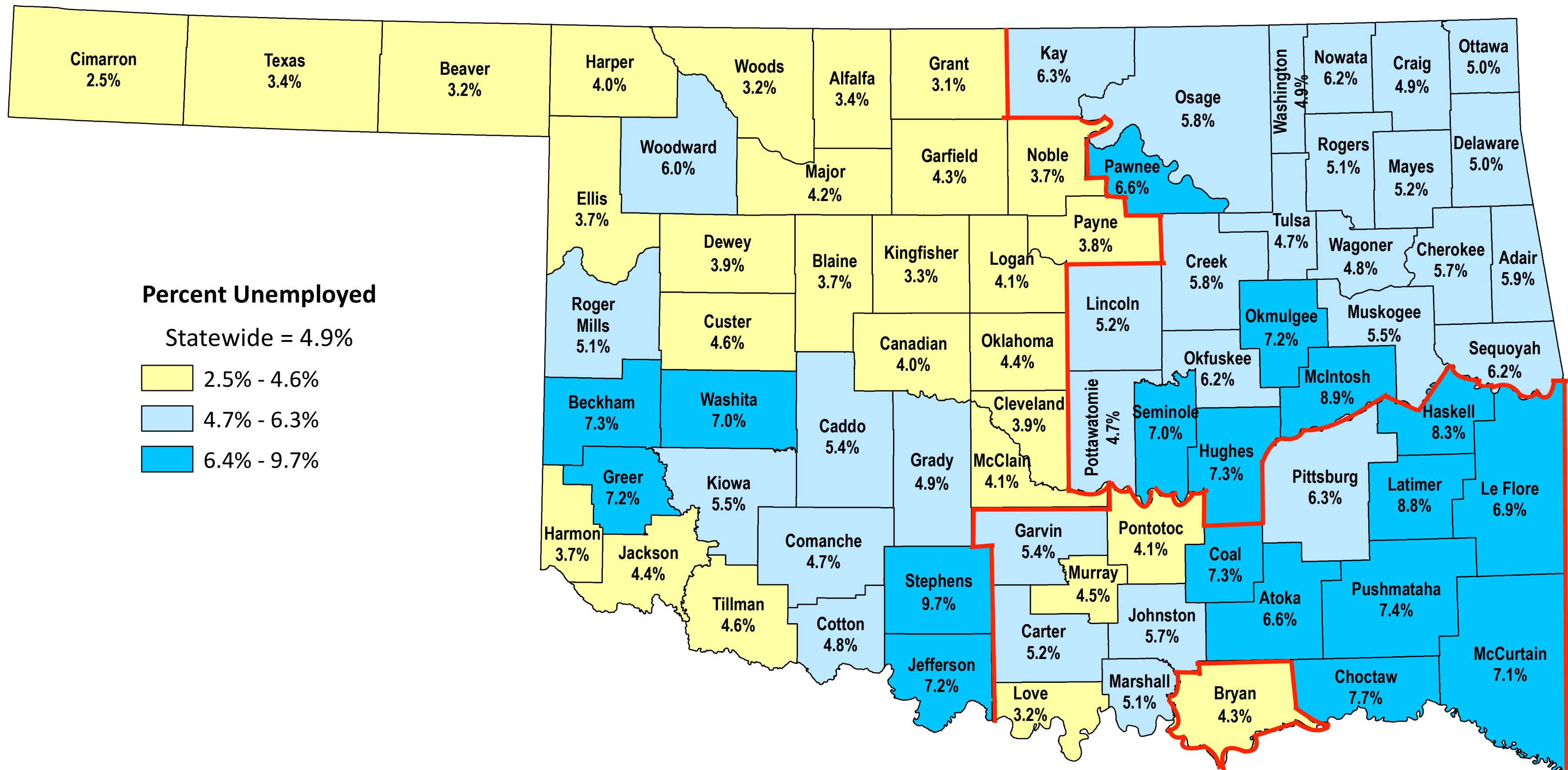
Durant Per Capita Personal Income 2002 - 2015

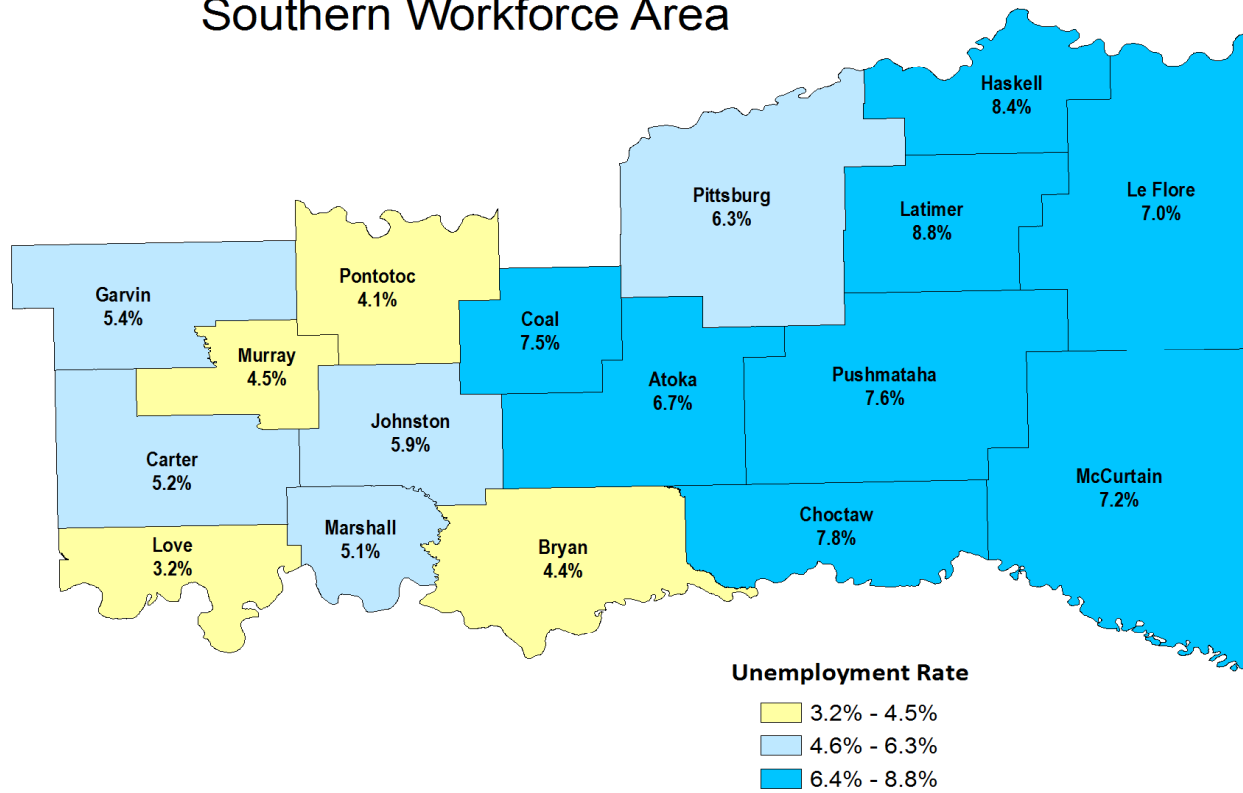
Rolling 12-Month Averages, March 2016 - February 2017



Bryan County is the 3rd Lowest in Unemployment Southern Workforce Area and the 40 Eastern Oklahoma Counties

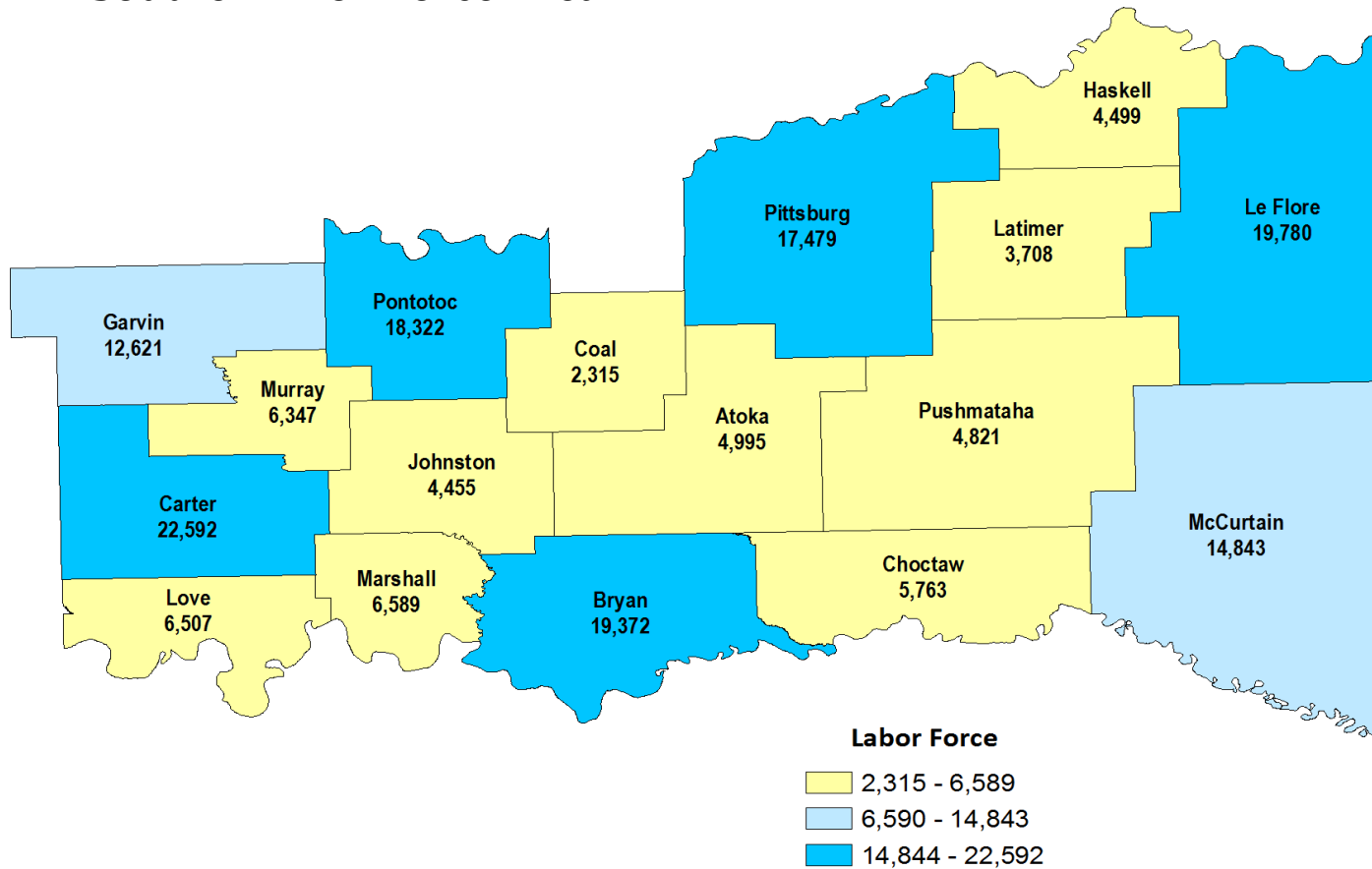

Hitchcock Distributing, Incorporated

Hitchcock Distributing is a third generation Durant owned and operated company, which distributes their products in the Southeastern Oklahoma area.

They held a groundbreaking ceremony on June 10, 2015 for their new distribution center. The construction work began in November 2016 and is scheduled to be completed in September 2017. The Durant Industrial Authority funded an Employee Grant of \$16,369.



Commercial Metals Company

Commercial Metals Company is a 100 year old company is headquartered in Irving, Texas and operates more than 120 recycling centers, steel mills, fabrication facilities, marketing and distribution offices, construction related product stores, and heat treating facilities in more than 12 countries.

The CMC Durant steel mill broke ground in April 2016. This steel mill will produce 380,000 tons of steel product annually and bring approximately 250 jobs to our community, making this the largest industrial business investment in the history of Bryan County to date.

Currently, CMC has 65% of its staff hired, as well as approximately 450 contractors on site with the buildings being over 95% sheeted. The scale house and administrative buildings will be completed in May 2017. The OG&E substation, energized from one transmission line will have permanent power by June 2017 and the Oklahoma Department of Transportation is scheduled to complete the on/off ramps by August 2017. The plant is still on schedule for a Fall 2017 opening.



SteelFab, Incorporated

Steel Fabrication Service founded by J. Glenn Sherrill in 1955 was incorporated in 1960 to SteelFab, Inc. From the beginning as a small handrail fabrication shop in Charlotte, NC to their position today as one of the largest suppliers of fabricated structural steel, SteelFab has remained committed to providing outstanding customer service, quality and safety. They currently have facilities in North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Alabama, Georgia, and Texas.

SteelFab, Inc. currently has six different fabrication plants across Southeastern United States with a combined capacity of 100,000 tons annually. These plants utilize the latest high-tech machinery, top-notch facilities and cutting edge computer driven processes. The most important components of its fabrication capacity are the over 500 highly skilled employees working throughout these plants. Their employees are true craftsmen whose skills, knowledge and passion are poured into each piece that leaves the plant.

The new Durant facility will be a state of the art design located on 50 acres and will employ 100-150 members. The facility is scheduled to be operational in May 2018.



WebstaurantStore

WebstaurantStore is based in Lancaster, PA and began in 2004 creating and fostering the largest online restaurant supply store, serving food service professionals and individual customers worldwide, and is currently shipping over 5.5 million orders.

Durant was chosen to be their 6th distribution center with an investment of \$20,000,000 and creating 200 new jobs for our community. Renovations of the 350,000 square foot building began in January 2017 and are scheduled to be completed by July 2017. The hiring of employees will begin in June 2017 and the Durant facility is scheduled to be fully operational in Fall 2017.



The Tile Shop

The Tile Shop was founded in 1985 and has a network that comprises over 100 locations, including Durant, OK. The Tile Shop company is headquartered in Plymouth, MN.

The Durant Industrial Authority assisted The Tile Shop with its Phase I, II and III building projects for a new 88,000 square foot expansion to the facility, which created approximately 60 jobs for our community. The expansion was completed in May 2017.

Cardinal Glass Expansion

Cardinal Glass is looking ahead of the float glass industry by using new technologies that will meet even tomorrow's marketplace. Their constant growing spirit is taking glass manufacturing to a higher level of quality and their furnace design gives them an excellent system for producing float glass in a nonstop environment.

Within the past year Cardinal FG Durant has made many changes. By the end of 2016 they added a 112,000 square foot warehouse, bringing the total under roof to 533,000 square feet. In January 2017 the existing furnace was shut down and drained to bring the 80-day glass-to-glass, cold repair and the furnace was completely rebuilt, along with the tin bath and annealing lehr. During these 80 days, the cold end of the operation was also refurbished and updated, as well as installing a new state of the art Tri-Mer pollution control system making Cardinal FG Durant a permitted minor source polluter and as clean an operation as any glass plant in the world.

Cardinal FG Durant has invested well over \$60,000,000 in these projects and is currently operating near capacity at over a 90% yield supplying Cardinal and many other customers with the best glass in the industry.

Country Club Road Construction

The construction of Country Club Road was funded with \$500,000 from the Durant Industrial Authority and \$525,000 from a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). The road construction was completed in January 2017. The two new companies locating in the Durant East Industrial Park are Overland Materials & Manufacturing, Inc. and SteelFab, Inc.

Southeastern Oklahoma State University

Southeastern Oklahoma State University (SE) was founded in 1909 and is linked by tradition to the geographic region of southeastern Oklahoma and north central Texas with a current enrollment of **3,415**.

Currently there are four academic schools within SE: Arts and Sciences, John Massey School of Business, Education and Behavioral Sciences and Graduate and University Studies. Additionally, SE offers Outreach Sites in Ardmore OK, Denison TX, Idabel, OK, McAlester OK, Midwest City OK, Oklahoma City OK and Van Alstyne TX.

The Academic Programs in Aviation, Occupational Safety and the Massey School of Business makes Southeastern one of the few schools in Oklahoma to be accredited by the Association of Advance Collegiate Schools of Business International.



Durant Public Schools

Throughout the years, Durant Public Schools have maintained an outstanding curriculum winning both state and national honors in scholastic, music and sporting events. As of April 2016, Durant Public Schools has an enrollment of **3,731** students.

There are three Elementary Schools from Pre-K to 3rd grade: Northwest Heights, Robert E. Lee and Washington Irving. Durant Intermediate School teaches 4th – 6th grades, Durant Middle School teaches 6th – 8th grades and Durant High School teaches 9th – 12th grades.



Victory Life Academy (VLA) is a private Christian School, offering full curriculum education from Pre-K through 12th grade. VLA is fully accredited under the Oklahoma Private School Accreditation Commission and as of April 2016 has an enrollment of **145** students.



Kiamichi Technology Center

Kiamichi Technology Center (KTC) Durant Campus provides full-time and short time educational programs and services to secondary and adult students with an average enrollment of **300** students. Programs include Automotive, Health Care, Business Administration, Culinary Arts, Welding and more.

The Business and Industrial Service Division offers the Training for Industry Program (TIP), at the Durant facility, which provides **NO COST** customized training for new industries in Durant, Oklahoma. To date in 2017 there were **1,251** employees trained in industrial education classes.

KTC – Durant serves the Bryan County community as well as the following schools: Achille, Bennington, Caddo, Calera, Colbert, Coleman, Durant, Rock Creek, Silo and Victory Life. KTC empowers their students with the technical skills required for today's competitive work environment.

Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma

Durant Casino and Resort

The Choctaw Nation began as a tribe of farmers and has grown into twelve tribal districts and the country's third largest tribe with a membership of approximately 300,000. The Choctaw people pride themselves on preserving and celebrating their many unique traditions from the distinctive language, artistry, dances and historical games.

Over 90 years ago, there were 19 young Choctaw soldiers that volunteered their services to the United States Army and they were known as the Code Talkers (picture below). They served, sacrificed and were the first to use their native language to confuse the enemy, making a marked difference in the outcome of World War I.

In 2015-2016, the Choctaw Casino and Resort expanded to include restaurants, hotel expansion, bowling lanes, arcade, movie theater, swimming pool and water slides. The resort also has additional conference, event and meeting space as well as a ballroom for banquets. The Choctaw Casino and Resort employs approximately **3,000**.

AllianceHealth Durant

AllianceHealth Durant serves Atoka, Bryan, Choctaw, Johnston and Marshall counties and offers a full range of medical services and procedures to patients. This facility has 148 beds and is one of the largest tax paying entities in Bryan County and employs approximately 173 medical staff members.

AllianceHealth Durant is home to a Trauma Level III Emergency Room, fully diagnostic imaging center, a 20,000 square foot Women's Center, wound care & hyperbaric center, "New Visions" medical stabilization program, home health services, inpatient/outpatient surgical services, physical therapy and much more.

One of the fundamental values at AllianceHealth Durant is their commitment to the local community. They maintain the commitment both collectively as an organization and individually in the personal contributions.

Durant Fire Department

The Durant Fire Department (DFD) Central Fire Station is located at 122 North First Street. The DFD will focus its efforts on a safe and rapid response to all emergencies and provide the city with appropriate intervention and community education.

The DFD is compiled of thirty-six (36) dedicated firefighters, many of whom are certified Emergency Medical Technicians and Paramedics and who deliver an 'all-hazards' response to our community. Our citizens benefit from the **3/3Y ISO** rating the department has received through Fire Protection, Water Resources and the 911 Dispatch Center

The mission of the Durant Fire Department is to stand committed to protection of life, health, property and the environment for the citizens of Durant and those visiting our city.



Durant Police Department

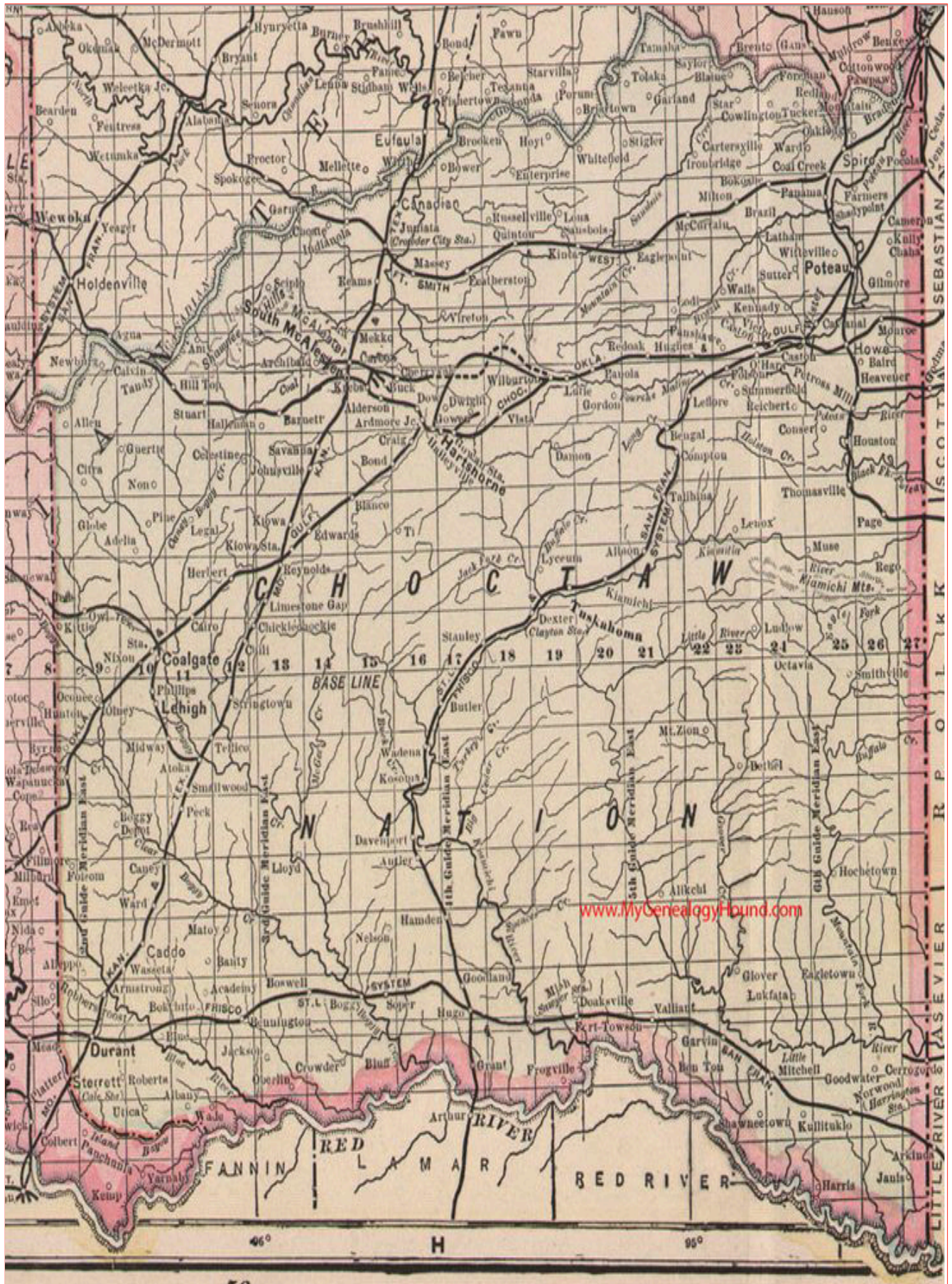
The Durant Police Department is located at 3104 Carl Albert Drive. In January 2008 the DPD became the tenth (10th) in Oklahoma to obtain accreditation through the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Agency Accreditation and Professional Standards Program.

The DPD is compiled of sixty (60) employees, forty-one (41) of which are sworn certified officers. The department also includes a reserve force of thirteen (13) dedicated volunteers.

The DPD provides 911 communications service and dispatching for all emergency services for Bryan County in Fire, Emergency Medical Services and Law Enforcement.
